

Lead changes in second round; Flower Mound girl takes slim lead heading to final round

Kathy Whitworth, an LPGA Hall of Fame player who has won more tournaments than anyone, including those on the PGA Tour, will be presenting the Championship Trophy at the Ben Hogan Center on Wednesday. Last year, Angela Stanford, a former four-time city junior winner who's currently on the LPGA Tour, presented the trophy.

Hayley Dambold, a 17-year-old 8-5A all-district player from Flower Mound Marcus, shot the day's best score of four-over 74 from the white tees at finely-groomed River Crest Country Club on Tuesday, July 10, to edge into a one-shot lead after 36 holes in the 2012 FWJGA Girls City Junior Golf Championship.

She'll head into Wednesday's final round at Colonial Country Club with a shot lead over Kellie Martin, a 17-year-old from Burleson who attends Mansfield Legacy High School. Hayley, who opened with a 79 at Glen Garden G&CC on Monday, has a 153 total. Kellie shot her second 77 for a 154, a shot in front of Jessie White, a 17-year-old all-district player from Mansfield High School. Jessie shot a 79 at River Crest and is two shots in front of Adriana Morillo, a 16-year-old from Southlake Carroll, who came in with a 78 for a 157.

Hayley, playing River Crest for the first time, slipped to four-over par on the front nine, but two birdies helped her rebound to an even-par 35 on the back. She bogeyed the 18th hole after shanking her second shot from a sand trap. She also had bogeyed the par-5 ninth en route to her 39 on the front nine.

"I hit a lot of fairways and greens, and my irons were on target," she said, adding that the course was "awesome. It's a great course," and said she's excited about finishing at Colonial.

Kellie said her driver was "really good. I hit almost every fairway." However, Kellie said her putter wasn't so accurate and she had two three-putts. A double-bogey six on the third hole led to a 50 on the

front nine.

Last year's runner-up Erica Lautensack, 16, of Arlington added a 79 to her opening 81 and is hanging close with a 160.

First-round leader Kyoung Kim, a 14-year-old from Crowley who has been playing golf for only two years and who shot a 75 at Glen Garden, found water and sand trouble at River Crest and finished with a 99.

Flights were determined after the second round. After Monday's round, the lowest 31 in the 18-hole division advanced to River Crest and the others went to Diamond Oaks C.C. The 31 players at River Crest were divided into the Championship and First flights.

Amy Cox, 16, of Colleyville, led the 18-hole girls who went to Diamond Oaks by shooting a 77 from the red tees, taking a three-shot lead in the Second Flight with a 164. Leah Hudson, 15, of North Richland Hills is second at 157 after shooting an 80. The best score was carded by Kelly Fritchey, 17, of Keller, who came in with a 75 to move into contention at 161.

In the 9-hole division, Quinn Barber, 12, of Grapevine, has taken a commanding lead in the Championship Flight as she followed her opening 44 from the red tees with a 40 for a two-day 84 total. She leads by 12 shots.

In the 9-hole short tees division, Amy Moon, 8, of Fort Worth posted a 47 after an opening 43 and her 90 leads by 17 shots for the championship.
